27th Avenue Corridor Community Safety and Crime Prevention Plan Passed by the City Council



Lupe, 27th Ave. resident, and Petra, a small business owner, organized a meeting of about 70 neighbors, where we discussed safety concerns on their streets and how it was affecting their community. We shared the Community Safety Plan and discussed how we can work together for a more secure neighborhood.

On February 16th, the 27th Avenue Corridor Community Safety and Crime Prevention Plan was approved by a vote at the Formal City Council meeting.

Many groups contributed to this victory, and during the weeks leading up to the meeting, our office engaged hundreds of residents, many of whom called in and submitted comments to support the plan.

A special thanks to our neighborhood leaders, especially from the Violence Impact Project (VIP) Coalition and Stand for Children. In addition, we thank our education partners, Alhambra Elementary and Washington Elementary School Districts and Grand Canyon University. Our priority is to ensure the success of this plan which includes \$5 million of additional resources to support the multi-department collaborative efforts to keep our families safe.

Demolition of the "Old" Village Inn and update on Innovation 27, the "Old" Kmart



On February 15th, as workers demolished the "old" Village Inn restaurant on Northern Ave. and the I-17, we celebrated with the Neighborhood Services Department along with neighbors of the VIP Coalition, and the North Glen Square and Alta Vista neighborhood associations. This vacant property had been attracting blight and crime for over ten years. Now, we can turn our attention to Innovation 27 in the adjacent "old" Kmart.

On March 23rd, the City Council will vote to approve the final purchase amount for the "old" Kmart with ARPA funds. Innovation 27, a collaboration of multiple entities will provide muchneeded community education, workforce training, and job creation.



Grand Canalscape Phase 3 - Public Meeting on March 30th



The City of Phoenix Street Transportation Department is continuing enhancements to the Grand Canal. Phase 3 of the project will transform the dirt path between 75th Avenue and 47th Avenue to an improved canal trail with:

- Concrete pedestrian and bicycle pathway along the north bank of the canal
- Signalized crosswalks where the path crosses existing streets
- Lighting
- Landscaping where possible

During Black History Month, we introduced the City of Phoenix's first African-American City Manager, Jeff Barton. He took on the role in October 2021, after serving as Assistant City Manager since February 2021. Prior to that he served as Deputy City Manager since March 2020 and served as the director of the city's Budget and Research Department since July 2015.

Barton's 21-year career with the City of Phoenix started in 1999, as an internal auditor in the City Auditor Department. In the years that followed, he held a variety of roles that focused on the city's sound financial stewardship, including multiple auditing positions, management assistant, and deputy Budget and Research Director.
