Area residents are making inspirational improvements by forming a new neighborhood group – such as the Berkley Square Neighbors – and working together to collect signatures to request gated alleys and speed humps.


Grand Re-opening of West Plaza Park

Grand-35th Avenue Meeting and Survey



The Arizona Department of Transportation (ADOT) will host a public meeting as part of an ongoing study of proposed improvements to the Grand Avenue intersection with 35th Avenue and Indian School Road (known as the <u>Grand-35 Study</u>). The meeting is scheduled on Tuesday evening (Jan. 31), at Alhambra High School in Phoenix.

The meeting will review two options for building new bridges to carry 35th Avenue and Indian School Road traffic over Grand Avenue (US 60) and the nearby BNSF

Railway tracks. The alternatives are being recommended as a way to improve the movement of traffic in the area.


