

Life-Changing Impact of a CASA Volunteer

"I met my CASA youth over 10 years ago when she was a young girl and removed from her home due to her parents' addiction issues. I helped arrange for the services she needed, assisted in finding a good school program, and made sure she was adjusting well with her new life. When she was about to graduate from high school, she shared with her high school counselor that she wanted to attend UCLA and be a child advocacy attorney. He told her that she should be more "realistic." I encouraged her to follow her dreams. She graduated from the UCLA Law Program with top honors and is representing children in situations similar to hers. I'm so glad I could be a part of her realizing her dreams and giving other vulnerable children hope."
