

Neighborhood Notification: Bicycle Improvements on 56th Street from Loop 101 to Deer Valley Road

As part of the Street Transportation Department's core mission, we strive to improve the City's roadways to create a safe and efficient transportation network. Our ongoing pavement maintenance program provides opportunities to change the current traffic lane striping to improve safety for people who walk, drive, ride bicycles and use transit.

About the Project

Where: 56th Street from Loop 101 to Deer Valley Road.

What: Where there is enough space on the roadway, a buffer will be added to the bicycle lanes. The number of travel lanes will remain the same. This project does not remove or add parking.

When: Pavement maintenance (new asphalt) is scheduled for May of 2022 and traffic lane improvements will happen shortly after.

Why: Buffers add space between people driving and people walking or biking for increased protection from vehicles, improved safety and added comfort. Additionally, the slight narrowing of the lane widths to accommodate the buffers will help to guide cars and deter speeding.
