CITY OF PHOENIX IMPROVES TO CRS CLASS 5

What is CRS?

The Community Rating System (CRS), developed by the National Flood Insurance Program (NFIP), rewards a community-centered approach to reducing flood hazards while protecting the natural and beneficial functions of a community's flood prone lands. The communities flood insurance premiums are discounted based on work done by the community to increase flood resiliency.

How was CRS Class 5 achieved?

- Certifications and permits
- Public outreach
- Update to city's Floodplain Management Plan
- Increased mapping information and data maintenance
- Increased regulations for new and existing infrastructure
- Preservation and restoration of natural floodplains

What are the benefits of CRS classifications?

- Reduction in flood insurance premiums up to 25 percent
- Encourages improvement to flood management activities
- Improvements to public safety
- Increased local awareness of flooding risks
- Fosters successful relationship with government agencies

Policies and Discounts

For the past 17 years, Phoenix has had a Class 6 rating, allowing a 20 percent discount on flood insurance premiums. Since then, Phoenix has been working towards achieving higher standards to obtain better designation for its residents. Recently, the city achieved standards to obtain a Class 5 rating, increasing the discount to 25 percent. The Class 5 designation goes into effect October 1st, 2018.

What should residents do?

Find out if your home or business is in a special flood hazard area (SFHA)

If so, you may want to consider purchasing flood insurance. You can apply for flood insurance even if your home or business is not in a SFHA to reduce the cost of damages caused by localized flooding.

Elevation certificates are used to calculate the flood insurance policy risk rate if your home or business is in a SFHA. Find out if there is an elevation certificate on file or to see if your property is in a SFHA. Also consider having a list of your personal property and taking photos of your home or business to assist your insurance adjuster. Remember to keep all important information and electronic equipment in a safe and dry place.
