This activity book will help the young people in your world become wise users of city streets, sidewalks, signals and signs.


Community safety is a shared responsibility. We hope the fun activities in this book spark conversation and safe behaviors.





WHO IS CONSIDERED A PEDESTRIAN?

A pedestrian is anybody who walks or runs on the sidewalk or street. Pedestrians can also use bicycles, scooters, skateboards, skates, mobility scooters, tricycles, or use a wheelchair. USE THE SPACES BELOW TO DRAW PEDESTRIANS.



Walking is the oldest form of transportation. We are all pedestrians at some point. Pedestrian safety is a two-way street. Whether you drive or walk, it is up to you to keep yourself safe.




SAFEST PATH

SAFETY TIPS FOR WALKING IN THE DARK

In addition to the safety tips on page 22:

- Wear reflective clothing. Did you know reflective clothing is made of very tiny glass beads coated with metal? The tiny beads are half the size of a human hair and are glued to clothing materials to create a surface that reflects very brightly with any light that shines on it.
- Carry a flashlight with you. A flashlight or a headlamp can help illuminate your walking path and will keep you visible to drivers.
- Walk on the sidewalk facing traffic so you can see what the vehicles are doing.


YELLOW signs warn pedestrians and drivers about what can be found ahead

FIND THE OBJECTS


Intersections are places where roads cross each other or "intersect."

PUBLIC TRANSIT SAFETY

Did you know Phoenix is one of the largest cities in the United States? Like most large cities, Phoenix has different transportation options like the light rail to help people reach many destinations.

Have you seen the light rail? Have you ever ridden the bus?

Do you know how to be safe near light rail tracks, stations, and bus stops?

- ▲ Wait in the Safe Zone. On the sidewalks, the Safe Zone is 3 big steps away from the curb. At the light rail station, the Safe Zone is behind the textured strip.
- Use the crosswalk to cross the street and the tracks.
- Wait for the train behind the textured strip.
- Never run after or next to a moving bus or train! Chances are another one will be by shortly.








WHAT IS A "HAWK"? HIGH INTENSITY ACTIVATED CROSSWALK

Is it a bird!? Not quite! It's just a special traffic signal to help people cross the road. Have you seen one?






We walk to get to places like school to study, the park to play, the store to buy food. Walking is a great way to experience our neighborhood and learn more about our city.

TOP 10 SAFETY TIPS FOR PEDESTRIANS

EXTRA TIP: Your cellphone
can wait, pay attention to the road
and make sure you can see and hear
what is happening around you.

- 1 Always look left, right, and left again before crossing the street and make sure you have enough time to cross.
- 2 Read and follow all roadway signs and devices, they are there for your protection.
- 3 Don't assume drivers will see you, you may not be visible to them.
- 4 Stay alert, don't walk or cross streets distracted.
- 5 Be visible by wearing bright clothing during the day and carry a flashlight or wear reflective gear at night.
- 6 Walk facing oncoming traffic so you can see it easily.
- 7 Always try to cross the street at marked or signalized intersections, where drivers expect to see you.
- 8 Make eye contact with drivers to make sure they see you and they are not distracted.
- **9** Don't try to cross until cars have stopped.
- 10 Whenever possible stay on the sidewalks and cross the street at the crosswalks.
