

ASU Downtown Phoenix campus Facts & Figures 2008-09

- As of Fall 2008, approximately 1,200 faculty and staff support ASU's Downtown Phoenix Campus.
 - Build-out estimates project 1,800 faculty and staff
- In Fall 2008 there were 4,963 students physically attending the Downtown Phoenix Campus². There were a total of 8,431 students enrolled in classes funded by Downtown² in Fall 2008.
 - Projections call for 15,000 students at build-out
- Breakdown of Fall 2008 enrollment by Program / College²:
 - Nursing- 2,017
 - Public Programs- 1,606
 - University College- 2,789
 - Cronkite School- 1,197
 - Other Colleges- 822
- Total undergraduate Nursing students for 2008-09 school year is 1,800 which makes it one of the largest colleges of nursing in the U.S.²
- Total annual economic impact of the ASU Downtown Phoenix campus at build out is estimated at \$216 million.¹
- Grand total direct and indirect economic impact of the Campus at build-out is \$570 million and 7700 jobs.¹
- At build-out the City of Phoenix is projected to collect \$7.3 million per year in sales taxes because of the ASU Downtown Phoenix campus.¹
- The Campus, at build-out, is projected to contain 1.5 million square feet of academic and academic support space and almost one million square feet of private commercial and retail space.
