YOUR VOTE IS YOUR VOICE

On Tuesday, May 20, 2008, the city of Phoenix will hold a citywide Special Election for voters to decide a ballot measure that would extend the existing sales tax for parks and preserves that is scheduled to expire in 2009. The Sample Ballot and Publicity Pamphlet for this election was mailed to all registered voters in mid-April and is available at phoenix.gov or by calling the City Clerk Department.

Voting at the Polls

The polls will be open from 6 a.m. to 7 p.m. on Tuesday, May 20, 2008.

There are several ways to determine your polling place:

- The polling place name and address is identified on the back cover of the Sample Ballot and Publicity Pamphlet that was mailed to all registered voters in April.
- A polling place locator application is available at phoenix.gov. Enter your residence address and the locator will provide the name and address of your polling place and a map showing the location.
- Call the City Clerk Department election information line at 602-261-VOTE (8683). For the hearing-impaired, call the Teletypewriter (TTY) number at 602-534-2737.

Voter Identification at the Polls

Every voter is required to show proof of identity at the polling place to receive a ballot. Specific forms of photo or non-photo identification with the voter's name and address are required, and the identification must match the voter's name and address shown on the voter registration roll. A list of the acceptable forms of identification appears in the Sample Ballot and Publicity Pamphlet mailed to all registered voters in April and is also available at phoenix.gov.

Voters who do not present acceptable identification may vote a provisional ballot at the polls, but may be required to present acceptable identification to an election official no later than 5 p.m. on the Friday after the election.

Early Ballots

Early ballots must be received by the City Clerk's Office by 7 p.m. on Election Day to be counted. The following options are available for a voter who has not yet returned their early ballot:

- Vote the ballot, place it in the signed affidavit envelope, and drop it off at any polling place in the city or at City Hall, 200 W. Washington Street.
- Any voter who was issued an early ballot may go to their polling place to vote, but will be required to cast a provisional ballot.

Voter Information Line

The city of Phoenix will operate a voter information telephone line on Election Day **from 5 a.m. to 7 p.m.** to assist voters with information about the election or polling place locations.
