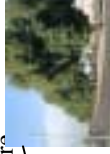

Some years there are a lot of trees listed. Some years none; some years a few. Why?

In the beginning we chose a Special Tree or two of the Year. Then we became a Pilot Project for Great Trees of Arizona, and it was decided that if any nominated tree was a great tree, we would recognize it.

Do we ever not recognize a tree that has been nominated?

Yes, if there are structural defects, such as a codominant stem. Or if there's a reason for nominating the tree that really doesn't have anything to do with the tree. Yes, we really admired the tree house that was in one tree, but the tree wasn't that great!

Why are there so many Great Trees in the Central area of the City?

Because it's the oldest part of the City and the trees have had the chance to grow the most. And many nominations have been received from that area of the City.

What makes a tree "Great?"

Great Trees can be defined as any individual or group of trees that is considered to be of local, state, national or international significance. This significance may be measured in various ways, such as:

- ❖ In terms of history,
- ❖ Age of the tree,
- ❖ Extraordinary size,
- ❖ Or being of a rare or unusual species.

How do I nominate a tree?

Call (602) 495-3763 and a Nomination Form will be mailed to you. Nominations are due by February 1 every year. Winners are announced during Arbor Day month (That's April!).

PHOENIX REGISTER OF BIG TREES

Have you seen any of the following that are really big trees? If so, call us at (602) 495-3763 and we'll help measure for a possible champion Big Tree. Needed is the circumference of the tree in inches at 4 1/2 feet above the ground, height of the tree to the nearest foot, and the average diameter of the crown to the nearest foot.
