VOTER REGISTRATION DEADLINE CITY OF PHOENIX COUNCIL ELECTION SEPT. 1, 2009

Monday, Aug. 3 is the last day to register to vote in the Sept. 1 City of Phoenix Council Election. In this election, voters in Districts 2, 4, 6 and 8 will elect City Council members. To be eligible, a person must be a registered voter and reside within City Council Districts 2, 4, 6 or 8 at least 29 days prior to this city of Phoenix election.

There is no election in Council Districts 1, 3, 5 or 7 because the

terms of the council members are staggered and there is no election for mayor or propositions this year.

Voter registration forms are available at most libraries and government facilities, including the lobby of Phoenix City Hall, 200 W. Washington St., or at the City Clerk Department on the 15th Floor. Registration forms also are available from the County Recorder's Office at recorder.

CITY OF PHOENIX COUNCIL ELECTION TUESDAY, SEPT. 1, 2009 SAMPLE BALLOT PAMPHLET

The City of Phoenix will hold a Council Election on Sept. 1 for voters in Council Districts 2, 4, 6 and 8 to elect Council Members. A Sample Ballot Pamphlet will be mailed the week of July 27 to each residence address in these districts where there is a registered voter. It will identify the voter's polling place and early and accessible voting locations. The Sample Ballot Pamphlet also is available

at phoenix.gov/ELECTION/voteidx.html or from the City Clerk Department.

There is no election in Council Districts 1, 3, 5, or 7 because the terms of the council members are staggered and there is no election for mayor or propositions this year.

Alternative Formats
To ensure voting privacy, convenience and accessibility,
