NOTICE OF ELECTION SPECIAL COUNCIL ELECTION – DISTRICT 3 NOV. 3, 2009

The City of Phoenix will hold a Special Council Election on Tuesday, Nov. 3, 2009. In this election, voters in Council District 3 will elect a council member to fill the remainder of a term that expires Jan. 3, 2012.

A Runoff Election will be held on Tuesday, March 9, 2010 if no candidate receives a majority of the votes cast for an office in the November election.

Early Voting

Early voting begins on Monday, Oct. 5. Voters on the permanent early voting list were mailed a notice of the election the week of July 6. Voters on this list will receive a ballot by mail unless the voter returns the notice or notifies the City Clerk not to send the ballot by Saturday, Sept. 19. Voters not on the permanent list may submit a signed, written request for an early ballot by mail. Forms will be available at http://phoenix.gov/ELECTION/ebr_form.pdf and at city public service counters and city libraries. The City Clerk must receive a voter's signed request for a ballot by mail no later than Friday, Oct. 23.

Voting at the Polls

Polling places will be open from 6 a.m. until 7 p.m. on Election Day, Tuesday, Nov. 3. A voter's polling place will be identified on the back cover

of the Sample Ballot Pamphlet. This Pamphlet will be mailed in late September to each residence in District 3 where a registered voter resides. Voters can also use a polling place locator application on phoenix.gov to identify their district, precinct and polling place, and see a map of the location. EARLY VOTING STARTS COUNCIL ELECTION SEPT. 1, 2009

Early voting for the City of Phoenix Council Election starts on Aug. 3. In this election, registered voters in Districts 2, 4, 6 and 8 will elect Council Members. There is no election in Districts 1, 3, 5 and 7 because the terms of the council members are staggered and there is no election for mayor or propositions this year.

The deadline to register to vote in this election is Monday, Aug. 3.

Early Voting by Mail

Voters in Phoenix Council Districts 2, 4, 6 and 8 who are on the permanent early voting list will be mailed an early ballot unless they have elected not to receive one for this election. Voters in these

districts who are not on the permanent early voting list may request an early ballot by mail by submitting a signed, written request to the City Clerk Department. Request forms are available at phoenix.gov/ELECTION/voteidx.html, at city public service counters and libraries, or by calling the City Clerk Department, Elections Division. Early ballot requests must be received by the City Clerk Department no later than 5 p.m. Friday, Aug. 21.

Early Voting Locations and Accessible Voting Equipment

Several early voting sites will be available throughout the city for voters to cast an early ballot or exchange a damaged or spoiled early

ballot received by mail. Accessible voting devices that permit voters with disabilities to vote independently will be available at these sites. The list of locations, with the dates and times each are open, can be found in the Sample Ballot Pamphlet, by calling the City Clerk Department at the number below or at phoenix.gov/ELECTION/voteidx.html.
