CLOSE OF EARLY VOTING POLLING PLACE VOTING COUNCIL ELECTION SEPT. 1, 2009

The last day to vote early for the City of Phoenix Council Election is Friday, Aug. 28. In this election, registered voters in Districts 2, 4, 6 and 8 will elect Council Members. There is no election in Districts 1, 3, 5 and 7 because the terms of the council members are staggered and there is no election for mayor or propositions this year.

The deadline to register to vote for this election was Monday, Aug. 3.

Early Voting by Mail

Voted early ballots must be mailed or delivered to the City Clerk Department so that they are **received** by 7 p.m. on Election Day (Tuesday, Sept. 1). Voters may also deliver their voted early ballots to any city polling place on Election Day, before the polls close at 7 p.m.

Several early voting sites are available throughout the City until Aug. 28 for voters to cast an early ballot or exchange a damaged or spoiled early ballot. Accessible voting devices that permit voters with disabilities to vote independently are available at these sites. The list of locations, along with the schedule, can be found in the Sample Ballot Pamphlet as well as on the Internet at phoenix.gov/ELECTION/voteidx.html.

Polling Place Voting

On Election Day (Tuesday, Sept. 1), registered voters may cast their ballot at the polling place in their precinct from 6 a.m. to 7 p.m. There are several ways to find your polling place:

- The polling place name and address are listed on the back cover of the Sample Ballot Pamphlet that was mailed to each household occupied by a registered voter in Districts 2, 4, 6 and 8.
- A polling place locator application is available at phoenix.gov/ELECTION/voteidx.html. Enter your address and the locator will provide the name and address of your polling place, along with a map showing the location.
- Call the election information line at 602-261-VOTE (8683). For hearing- or speech-impaired individuals, a TTY line is available at 602-534-2737.

Voter Identification at the Polls

Each voter must show proof of identity at the polling place before receiving a ballot. Specific forms of photo or non-photo identification with the voter's name and address are required, and the identification must match the voter's name and address shown on the voter registration record. The acceptable forms of identification are listed in the Sample Ballot Pamphlet and at phoenix.gov/ELECTION/voteidx.html.

Voters who do not present acceptable identification may vote a Provisional Ballot at the polls, but may be required to present acceptable identification to an election official by 5 p.m. the Friday after the election.
