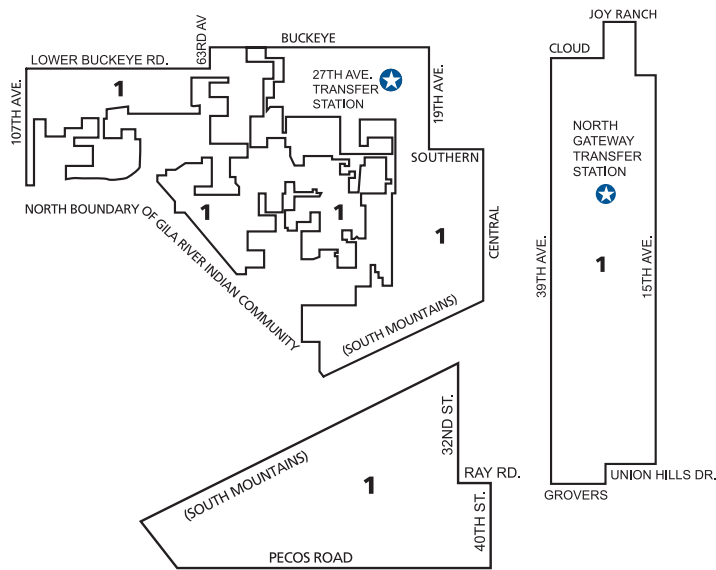

BULK TRASH COLLECTION

AREA 1 BEGINS SEPT. 8

Bulk Trash must be placed out by 6 a.m. 9-8-08



AREA 2 BEGINS SEPT. 15

Four times a year city crews collect bulk trash such as tree limbs, palm fronds, some large appliances and discarded furniture. All vegetation must be less than four feet long and 12 inches in diameter.
