



NOTICE OF ELECTION RUNOFF ELECTION – DISTRICT 6 NOV. 3, 2009

On Tuesday, Nov. 3, 2009, the City of Phoenix will conduct a Runoff Election in which voters in District 6 will elect a council member. This election is required by the City Charter because no candidate received a majority of the votes cast in the September Election for District 6.

Important Dates

- Earliest date to request a ballot by mail July 6, 2009
- Sample Ballot Pamphlet mailing begins Sept. 28, 2009
- Latest date to register to vote Oct. 5, 2009
- Early voting and mailing of early ballots begins Oct. 5, 2009
- Latest date to request a ballot by mail Oct. 23, 2009
- Last day to vote at early voting sites Oct. 30, 2009
- ELECTION DAY Nov. 3, 2009

Early Voting

Early voting begins on Monday, October 5. Voters in Council District 6 who received a ballot by mail for the Sept. 1, 2009 Council Election will receive a ballot by mail for the Runoff Election. Voters who did not receive a ballot by mail for the September Election but who wish to vote early by mail may submit a signed, written request for an early ballot by mail. Forms will be available at http://phoenix.gov/ELECTION/ebr_form.pdf and at city public service counters and city libraries. The City Clerk must receive a voter's signed request for a ballot by mail no later than Friday, October 23.

Voting at the Polls

Polling places will be open from 6 a.m. until 7 p.m. on Election Day, Tuesday, Nov. 3. A voter's polling place will be identified on the back cover of the Sample Ballot Pamphlet. This Pamphlet will be mailed in late September to each residence in District 6 where a registered voter resides. Voters can also use a polling place locator application on phoenix.gov to identify their district, precinct and polling place, and see a map of the location.
