VOTER REGISTRATION DEADLINE CITY OF PHOENIX COUNCIL ELECTIONS – DISTRICTS 3 AND 6 NOV. 3, 2009

Monday, Oct. 5, is the last day to register to vote in the Nov. 3 City of Phoenix Special Council Election and Runoff Election. In these elections, voters in Council Districts 3 and 6 will elect City Council members. To be eligible, a person must be a registered voter and reside within City Council Districts 3 or 6 at least 29 days prior to the election.

Voter registration forms are available at most libraries and government facilities, including the lobby of Phoenix City Hall, 200 W. Washington St., or at the City Clerk Department on the 15th Floor. Registration forms also are available from the County Recorder's Office at recorder.maricopa.gov/web/regform.aspx.
