



## Close of Early Voting Polling Place Voting

### Special Council Election and Runoff Election Nov. 3, 2009

The last day to vote early in the City of Phoenix Special Council Vacancy Election and Runoff Election is Friday, Oct. 30. In these elections, registered voters in Districts 3 and 6 will elect City Council members.

The deadline to register to vote in these elections was Monday, Oct. 5.

#### Early Voting by Mail

Voted early ballots must be mailed or delivered to the City Clerk Department so that they are received by 7 p.m. on Election Day (Tuesday, Nov. 3). Voters may also deliver their voted early ballots to any city polling place on Election Day, before the polls close at 7 p.m.

#### Early Voting Locations and Accessible Voting Equipment

Several early voting sites are available until Oct. 30 for voters to cast an early ballot or exchange a damaged or spoiled early ballot. Any voter may cast an early ballot at any of these locations. Accessible voting devices that allow voters with disabilities to vote independently also are available at these sites. #### Polling Place Voting

On Election Day (Tuesday, Nov. 3), eligible voters may cast a ballot at the polling place in their precinct from 6 a.m. to 7 p.m. There are several ways to find your polling place:

- The polling place name and address are listed on the back cover of the Sample Ballot Pamphlet that was mailed to each household in Districts 3 and 6 in which a registered voter resides.
- A polling place locator application is available at [phoenix.gov/ELECTION/d3vvoteidx.html](http://phoenix.gov/ELECTION/d3vvoteidx.html). Enter your address and the locator will provide the name and address of your polling place, along with a map showing the location.
- Call the election information line at 602-261-VOTE (8683). For hearing- or speech-impaired individuals, a TTY line is available at 602-534-2737.

#### Voter Identification at the Polls

Each voter must show proof of identity at the polling place before receiving a ballot. Specific forms of photo or non-photo identification with the voter's name and address are required. The acceptable forms of identification are listed in the Sample Ballot Pamphlet and at [phoenix.gov/ELECTION/d3vvoteidx.html](http://phoenix.gov/ELECTION/d3vvoteidx.html).

Voters who do not present acceptable identification may vote a Provisional Ballot at the polls, but may be required to present acceptable identification to an election official by 5 p.m. the Friday after the election.
