OPENING ART DETOUR WEEKEND: MARCH 24-26, 2006

- **Aaron Cuthbertson and Holly Carpenter: "Listening Stations"**
Whimsical interactive sculptures distort and amplify sounds in the park.
Location: north end of Steele Indian School Park
- **Donald Fodness: "Cuculidae"**
In an interactive performance, the artist explores "fitting in" vs. being out of place.
March 24: 6 - 9 pm, March 25: 10 am - 1 pm, March 26: 10 am - 1 pm
Location: Hance Park near Burton Barr Central Library
- **Joseph Lupiani and Daniel Hortung: "Solarflexus"**
A futuristic "submarine", solar powered and lit within and without by LED lights.
Location: Science and Heritage Park north of the Arizona Science Center

COMING IN APRIL 2006

- **Ron Floyd and Steve Merka:**
Playful and colorful fish sculptures made from found and reused objects.
Location: small island near the Amphitheater in Encanto Park

COMING IN MAY 2006

- **Mona Higuchi:**
Photographic installation reflecting on the internment of Japanese Americans in Arizona during WWII.
Location: in the fence along Van Buren between 9th and 10th Streets at Verde Park
- **Elena Lourenco: "The Collection Project"**
A sculptural installation that raises awareness of the preciousness of water in the desert.
Location: on the island near the golf course in Encanto Park
