




City of Phoenix Owns the Arena

- \$182 Million
- \$12.8 Million City
- \$14 Million State & County
- Jobs
 - 380 full time
 - 700 part time
 - 1,140 others












Facility Needs

- Plumbing
- Heating / AC
- Roof
- Electrical
- Technology
- Restrooms
- Accessibility (ADA)





Proposed Renovation Transaction

City

- \$150 Million Capped
- Paid from existing tourism tax
- \$2 Million per year to Reserve & Replacement fund
- Remain the landlord


<u>Suns</u>

- \$80 Million Plus any overruns
- Rent
 - Est. \$60 Million to the City
- New practice facility in Phoenix
 - Est. \$25-\$50 Million
- Tenant until 2037
- 100% operations / maintenance
- \$1 Million per year to Reserve & Replacement fund




Capital Investment Split




