## MAY 21, 2019 RUNOFF ELECTION EARLY VOTING BEGINS

Early voting for the Runoff Election begins on Wednesday, April 24, 2019. Registered voters residing in the City of Phoenix, Council District 5 will elect a Councilmember to serve the remainder of a term that expires April 19, 2021, and registered voters residing in the City of Phoenix, Council District 8 will elect a Councilmember to serve the remainder of a term that expires April 17, 2023.

The deadline to register to vote in this election is Monday, April 22, 2019.

## Early Voting by Mail

Voters who are on the Permanent Early Voting list (PEVL) will be mailed an early ballot unless they have elected not to receive one for this election. Voters who are not on the PEVL may request an early ballot by mail by submitting a signed, written request to the City Clerk Department. Request forms are available at <u>Phoenix.gov/Elections</u>, at City public service counters and libraries, by calling the City Clerk Department at 602-261-VOTE (8683) or using the 7-1-1 Relay System. Early ballot requests must be **received** by the City Clerk Department no later than 5 p.m. Friday, May 10, 2019.

Early ballots will be mailed beginning Wednesday, April 24, 2019.

## In-Person Early Voting and Accessible Voting Equipment

For individuals who wish to vote early in person rather than by mail, early voting will be available during business hours at Phoenix City Hall, 200 W. Washington St. 15th floor, from Wed. April 24, 2019 through Friday, May 17, 2019. Accessible voting devices that permit voters with disabilities to vote independently will be available at the early voting location.

Information about the status of a voter's early ballot is available at <u>Phoenix.gov/Elections</u>. Voters can obtain detailed information, such as the date the early ballot was mailed, received, or processed for tabulation. To check the status of an early ballot, voters will need to provide basic information along with either their voter registration number, or driver license or state issued identification number. This information is required in order to positively identify the voter. The information must match the information on the voter registration record.
