AUGUST 2017 COUNCIL ELECTION EARLY VOTING BEGINS

Early voting for the Council Election begins on Wednesday, Aug. 2, 2017. In this election, registered voters residing in Council Districts 2, 4, 6 and 8 will elect Councilmembers for a fouryear term. There is no election for the Mayor or Councilmembers in Districts 1, 3, 5 and 7 this year, because the Mayor and Councilmembers for these Districts, whose terms are staggered, were elected to four-year terms in 2015. There are no propositions on the ballot in this election.

The deadline to register to vote in this election is Monday, July 31, 2017.

Early Voting by Mail


Phoenix voters registered in Council Districts 2, 4, 6 and 8 who are on the Permanent Early Voting List (PEVL) will be mailed an early ballot unless they have elected not to receive one for this election. Voters who are not on the PEVL may request an early ballot by mail by submitting a signed, written request to the City Clerk Department. Request forms are available at <u>Phoenix.gov/Elections</u>, at City public service counters and libraries, by calling the City Clerk Department at 602-261-VOTE (8683) or using the 7-1-1 Relay System. Early ballot requests must be **received** by the City Clerk Department no later than 5 p.m. Friday, August 18, 2017.

In-Person Early Voting and Accessible Voting Equipment

For individuals who wish to vote early in person rather than by mail, early voting will be available during business hours at Phoenix City Hall, 200 W. Washington St., 15th floor, from Wednesday, Aug. 2, 2017 through Friday, Aug. 25, 2017. Accessible voting devices that permit voters with disabilities to vote independently will be available at the early voting location.

Information about the status of a voter's early ballot is available at <u>Phoenix.gov/Elections</u>. Voters can obtain detailed information, such as the date the early ballot was mailed, received, or processed for tabulation. To check the status of an early ballot, voters will need to provide basic information along with either their voter registration number, or driver license or state issued identification number. This information is required to positively identify the voter. The information must match the information on the voter registration record.
