## Redeveloped Affordable Senior Housing to Revitalize I-17 Corridor



We had an exciting meeting with U.S. Senator Mark Kelly and Mayor Kate Gallego and our neighborhood leaders to talk about affordable senior housing on August 13th.

Together, with the support of federal funding, we secured \$3 million for a project that will help revitalize an old hotel (formerly Super 8) by Northern Ave. and the I-17, which will offer 126 units of permanent senior housing. This initiative will prioritize low-income seniors aged 55 and older, converting a former hotel into a safe, comfortable home for those who need it most. We can't wait for the grand opening, which is scheduled for 2026!

This housing will be next door to two other important future projects: The Haven (formerly Phoenix Inn) will be an emergency shelter for seniors, and Innovation 27 (formerly K-Mart), a workforce training and education center. Click here to learn more from a news story. [kjzz.org]

# **PROJECTED OPENING DATE:** 2026 **CAPACITY:**

• 126 units of permanent senior housing

#### **RESIDENTS:**

- The housing program will prioritize low-income senior adults aged 55 or older.
- The City will coordinate referrals for prospective tenants and prioritize those with a rental subsidy.

#### **PURPOSE:**

- The City of Phoenix is converting the former hotel into permanent housing for seniors.
- This new effort will bring critically needed housing with onsite services for low-income (less than \$21,600 annually) seniors in our community.

#### **COMMUNITY REDEVELOPMENT AND INNOVATION 27:**

- The site is located next to the Haven, a new non-congregate emergency shelter for seniors, developed by Central Arizona Shelter Services (CASS) and Innovation 27 Workforce Training and Education Center to the south.
- The redevelopment will transform this area, bringing much needed affordable housing, and a state-of-the-art workforce and education facility.

# 19th Ave. Corridor Real Time Operations Center Opening Ceremony



On Wednesday, August 21st, we had an opening ceremony for another significant milestone for the 19th Ave. Corridor, the new fully operational Desert Horizon Police Precinct Real Time Operations Center (RTOC). This state-of-the-art facility is equipped with advanced technology to support our officers in responding to criminal activities effectively and in real time. Some of the high-tech equipment includes tilt-point-zoom cameras, license plate readers, and gunshot detection installed throughout the corridor.

The RTOC is a crucial part of our broader efforts to enhance safety and security throughout our community. Thanks to the Desert Horizon Police Precinct, and a special thank you to residents who advocated for and supported the RTOC, as part of the 19th
