Together with Arizona Community Foundation, Arizona Sustainability Alliance, Rumbo, SRP, Estrella Super Moms Block Watch, and our community volunteers, we planted 67 trees to beautify and cool our neighborhood.

As your District 5 Councilwoman, I'm proud to have directed over \$1.5 million in improvements to this park, including the splash pad and the baseball field improvements by the Arizona Diamondbacks. Let's keep making our community greener and our future brighter!



New Residential Grass Removal Incentive to Promote Water Conservation



Phoenix Water Services has launched a new program offering financial assistance to homeowners who replace their lawns with water-efficient, desert-

adapted landscapes. The initiative encourages residents to reduce outdoor water use by receiving \$2 per square foot for removing grass. This effort not only conserves water but could also help residents save money on their water bills. It's part of the City's broader commitment to sustainable urban living in a desert climate. Some key highlights are:

- Receive \$2 per square foot for removing at least 250 square feet of grass.
- Grass must be alive and healthy at a minimum of 75% density of the area to be removed.
- · Access to educational workshops for landscape design assistance.
- Applications are accepted on a first-come, first-served basis.

Christmas Tree and Wreath Composting



Every year, the Public Works Department offers Phoenix residents several drop-off locations for their live Christmas trees and wreaths to be composted.

Trees or wreaths may be dropped off at any of the participating Phoenix parks

(during park business hours) anytime between Thurs., Dec. 26, 2024 and Tues., Jan. 7, 2025. Only live trees and wreaths are accepted, not plastic trees and wreaths. Trees and wreaths will be composted at the City of Phoenix Compost Facility.
