Heat Respite and Cooling Centers



The City of Phoenix is expanding public heat relief options this year. For the first time, Phoenix offers two heat respite centers that will be accessible overnight. Now through Sept. 30, Burton Barr Central Library will operate as a 24-hour

respite center. Additionally, the Senior Opportunities West Senior Center at 7th Ave. and Buckeye will offer overnight respite hours daily from 6 p.m.-5 a.m.

Other cooling centers also have extended hours in 2024. Yucca, Cholla, and Harmon Libraries will now stay open as cooling centers Mondays through Saturdays until 10 p.m. On Sundays, these three locations will open as cooling centers from noon to 10 p.m. All other Phoenix Public Libraries now serve as cooling centers during their regular business hours.

Landlord and Tenant Workshop




Do you have any questions? We have answers! Landlord/tenant rights, security deposits, evictions, repairs and more!

The landlord and tenant program provides educational services and information to homeowners and tenants on their rights under the Arizona Residential Landlord and Tenant Act. We offer one-on-one counseling and education by telephone and in-person appointments at the Travis L. Williams Family Services Center. To make an appointment, call (602)262-7210 or email landlord.tenant.hsd@phoenix.gov.

The City of Phoenix also partners with Community Legal Services to provide the Tenants Eviction Assistance Project (TEAP). TEAP provides legal assistance, advocacy, and representation at no cost to help tenants navigate the Arizona eviction process. The next free workshop is July 10th. Click here for more information.

Fireworks Safety and Laws



Fireworks can be a fun way to celebrate various occasions, but they also present significant safety risks if not handled properly! Here are some fireworks safety tips recommended by the Phoenix Fire Departments:

Dispose of fireworks properly: After the fireworks display, clean up the area and dispose of used fireworks debris properly. Be sure to soak used fireworks in

water for at least 24 hours before disposing them! Any unused or malfunctioning fireworks should also be soaked in water for 24 hours before disposing.

Purchase from reliable sources: Buy fireworks only from permitted vendors! Never purchase homemade or illegal fireworks. They can be dangerous.

Designate a responsible adult: Assign a responsible adult to supervise fireworks activities. This person should have a clear understanding of how to safely handle fireworks and should not consume alcohol or drugs while doing so.

Choose a safe location: Select a clear, open outdoor area away from buildings, dry grass, and other flammable materials. Ensure there are no overhead obstructions such as trees or power lines.

Obey local laws: Ensure that fireworks are legal in your area before purchasing or using them. Follow all regulations and restrictions, you can learn more at Phoenix.gov/fire!





Yesterday, City Council approved the funding for a container vertical farm to be built by Homer Farms, Inc., a locally owned small business who established the first vertical farm in Phoenix in 2022. The project will be located on the vacant lot on 27th Ave. and Belmont Ave. The Office of Environmental Programs will provide oversight for the project and \$250,000 to be awarded through a Grant Agreement funded by the American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA). This project also contributes to the 2025 Food Action Plan goals of increased access to healthy food and further agri-food tech innovation. The project will:

- Use photovoltaics for power and integrate an energy storage system;
- Implement water-saving techniques;
- Support local food distribution of up to 20% of the produce grown; and
- Provide workforce development training in controlled environment agriculture (CEA) to residents and businesses in disadvantaged census tracts within the surrounding area.

Phoenix Fire Department is providing approximately one acre of land located at 2644 W. Belmont Ave. for a 3-year lease, with an option for a two-year

extension. SRP will award \$300,000 and ASU-KER will award \$50,000. ASU is interested in research and development opportunities to refine the technical performance of vertical farming systems, to understand the role these systems can play in urban food production, and to identify education and training needs and opportunities. Homer Farms is a clean-tech startup company based in Phoenix, Arizona that converts organic waste into liquid fertilizer and bioenergy to aid in the growth of organic food in vertical farms that we design and construct.
