The city's Neighborhood Services Department, the Anti-Graffiti Task Force, Phoenix Police, along with other city departments, are promoting February as "Graffiti Free Phoenix" month. Individuals, neighborhood and corporate organizations are encouraged to join the city to help make Phoenix graffiti free.

Here's how you can make a difference:

- Report graffiti in your community by calling 602-534-4444, extension 1, email blight@phoenix.gov (be sure to include the address if you know it) or click on "report it" on phoenix.gov and complete the online blight reporting form.
- Download the free smartphone app (MyPhxAz); use it to report graffiti and other blight violations.
- Report graffiti vandals by calling the Graffiti Hotline at 602-262-7327 and you may receive up to a \$250 reward
- Volunteer to remove graffiti by hosting a community cleanup.
- Keep your own property free of graffiti.
- Sign up to take a free Neighborhood College workshop and learn how to use a paint sprayer or pressure washer to remove graffiti.


Free paint and supplies will be provided to any group organizing a community cleanup to wipe out graffiti.



## UPDATE: FEDERAL AVIATION ADMINISTRATION FLIGHT PATH & PROCEDURAL CHANGES

The Federal Aviation Administration (FAA) new flight path and procedural changes have negatively impacted many neighborhoods in the Phoenix area since its adoption on September 18, 2014.

I requested the implementation of noise monitoring equipment in the newly affected areas to allow us to compare the noise levels from what they were prior to these changes.

The City of Phoenix Aviation Department hosted several meetings throughout the affected areas to provide an opportunity for the community members to discuss their concerns and solicit input on locations the City consultant can place temporary noise monitors. We will be collecting the data beginning this month with the results communicated to us late March. There were hundreds of residents at each of the meetings to voice their opinion on this important subject.

I want to thank all the residents who attended in meetings. I will continue to provide you with updates on this important issue that's so important to our communities. I will continue to advocate for our neighborhoods and quality of life for all.
