#### Homelessness Liaison

## Police

### Fireworks at 24th St & Broadway

- Loud noises is a concern, as is clarification on what fireworks are legal or not.
  - **Response:** Sgt. will push information out more to the community.

## Neighborhood Services

### Bulk Trash

- On call service, transition has been tricky. Residents have been placing trash out too early.
  - Response: To report early placement, call PWD 602-262-6251.

### Inoperable Vehicles

- For vehicles on the street, report to the Police Department.
- For vehicles on private property, report to NSD at 602-534-4444.

## Parks and Recreation

### Parking Concerns and Negative Activity

- Occurs on 19th Avenue south of Dobbins after park hours and is ongoing.
  - Response: Will be relayed to Park Supervisor and Deputy Director.
- Incidents take place in the street and right-of-way during evening hours when Parks staff is not on patrol

## Community and Economic Development & Light Rail

### Job Training Programs

- Provide job training programs with companies like UFI
- Bring mobile career unit to directly to sites.

### Start-Ups & Small Businesses

- Support start-ups and small businesses
  - Response: We have conducted 1,000 expansion and retention visits. Worked with small businesses, microbusinesses, and solo entrepreneurs.

## Streets

### Street Signal Timing

- Signal timing at 16th, 24th, and 32nd St and Roeser have very long wait times
  - Response: Traffic Management Center will review signal timing in next two weeks and provide an update to resident.

### No Parking Signage

- Wait times for no parking sign installation
  - Response: STR working on backlog of work orders. Will investigate installation time and update resident.



# SOUTH MOUNTAIN ENERGIZE EIGHT

## Office of Homeless Solutions

### Challenges

- Bus stops, parks, freeway ADOT property, and squatting issues
  - Community suggested getting more unsheltered into the Safe Outdoor Space
  - **OHS Response:** My PHX311 allows for 24-hour response time. If you're on private property, NSD now has slips for permission to enter.
- Santiago Gated Community – encampments inside and outside gated community

### Response Times & Resource Concerns

- Emphasis on the 24-hour response time via PHX311
- OHS provides better resources than CBI
- PHX CARES should not be automated, needs actual people.
- Private sector conducts services better

### Students at South Mountain Community College at risk of becoming homeless

- Proposed solution: Assistance programs for students, and focus on triggers to prevent homelessness



## Neighborhood Services

### Community Safety Concerns

- Residents are notified of sex offenders but need more accessible information of levels of offenders
- Discussions on better enforcement of developer stipulations (re-zoning, re-use)

### Parking and Vehicle Issues

- Illegal parking and inoperable vehicles in neighborhoods
- Potential solutions include coordination between NSD, PD, and tow services.

### Vacant Lots

- 16th St/Southern is vacant and abandoned. There's potential for revitalization from CED. Residents would like to know if there is a plan.

### PHX311 Issues

- Staff sent to residents' homes instead of problem sites; NSD is troubleshooting.

## Police

### Crime and Drug Activity

- Eg. Dobbins/Central – Drug activity and graffiti have increased and there is a lack of action.
- Residents propose that we hold criminals more accountable and work with PD to gather more information through the community
- Parked cars and blight

## Parks and Recreation

### Park Improvement Requests

- Add and replace missing littering signage in highly impacted parks
- Improve eroded trail at 32nd St. Provide a plan.
- Add a Ranger at the Gate House in South Mountain Park to create hospitality.
- Keep the South Mountain Park Race Track
  - Hopefully there is a grant to support the improvements. Parks will pass information to Natural Resource Division.

### Vandalism and Activity Monitoring

- Consider adding solar cameras to parks experiencing bad activity

## Community and Economic Development & Light Rail

### Underutilized Stops

- 24th St and Washington/Jefferson
  - **CED Response:** S 24th St was sold with multiple nonprofits. It received Transit-Oriented Development grants. The City is looking at bringing more affordable housing, health care, and healthy food options.

### Need for Grocery Stores and Restaurants from 24th St to Laveen

- Request for a Winco and improving Fry's at 24th/Baseline
- Consideration for more restaurants and medical services

### Sustainability in Transit

- Explore workforce opportunities with reliable, sustainable transit.

## Streets

### Street Projects & Safety

- Specific Requests: 20th St/Euclid – No speedbump or roundabout; 7th Avenue Sidewalks – lack of sidewalk, study was initiated and design started. Consultant on board.

### Heat Mitigation

- AZ Grand Project: Heat mitigation and asphalt on parking area
- Village Complaint: Baseline Rd & 40th St to Central – All trees plants dying.
- Can the City consider alternative materials for dust-proofing, especially in parking lots (Use Case in MUA District, Desert Marigold Charter School)
- Implement heat mitigation along streets and sidewalks (eg. more trees for concrete shade)

### Sidewalks

- Suggestion: Build detached sidewalks with easements for landscaping

### Speed Reduction and Calming

- Need more speed bumps around the City and more traffic-calming measures

### Drainage Improvements on Roadways

- Flooding issues impacts developments in areas like 15th Ave/Dobbins and 19th Ave/Baseline.

### Street Lighting Issues

- Areas impacted: 24th St/Broadway, 24th St/Roeser, 25th St Roeser to Broadway

### Traffic

- American Legion at 16th St & Broadway: Three exits cause east/west traffic backup.
- Turn Lange Suggestion: Add a turn lane on 16th St, going up to 17th St.

# CENTRAL CITY ENERGIZE EIGHT

## Streets

### Roosevelt (9th–12th St.)

- Issues with sidewalks, gaps, lighting, and curbing.
- Criteria for a study here was based on a 4-lane road instead of a 6-lane road at 7th St. and Roosevelt. W bound has a signal, but E bound does not. The community would like more information about traffic study.

### Legacy, Raymond/ 32nd & Vineyard – Southern Widening

- Request to install sidewalks
- There is a dead end on Vineyard, but this may be county property.
- Request for plants along 32nd–36th St Vineyard to Southern.

### McKinley & Garfield (12th–13th St.)

- Remove barricade in alley if possible.

### 18th Pl Wier–Broadway

- No Parking in Alley signs cut down

### Potholes, Debris, Sidewalks, Curb, Gutter

- Dispatch Number 8AM – 5PM: 602-262-6441 or DISPATCH at phoenix.gov is the best way to have Staff out as soon as possible.

### Verde Park

- Request for a micro-dog park to be built here due to high-density, multi-family housing and resident observation of 25 dogs walking a day.

### Community Win

- 13th St. Revamped with property drainage, sidewalks, and utility lines!

## Neighborhood Services

### Bulk Trash and Illegal Dumping in Alley

- Suggestion: Partner with Department of Corrections to engage low-level offenders in alley cleanup efforts.
- NSD: Encourage all residents to report issues through PHX311.

### Neighborhood Specialists and Customer Service

- More specialists can bring more guidance to community members.
- Difficult to get a return phone call from the City.
  - Suggestion: Perhaps neighborhood leaders can establish a report card based on experiences.

### 24th St & Broadway Activation

- RFPs for southwest corner received no responses.
- NSD now focused on engaging the community and nonprofits and expanding activation efforts to all four corners of the area.

### Vacant Properties in Garfield

- Ongoing issues with illegal dumping on city-owned vacant properties.
- Explore IT solutions to make it easier to people to report issues.

### Neighborhood Resource Center

- Currently speaking with nonprofit to activate.

### Future of Alleys

- Discuss the role of alleys in future developments, particularly in historic neighborhoods where alleys are essential infrastructure.

## Community and Economic Development & Light Rail

### Business Incubator & Workforce Training

- How can we make connections with our nonprofits through incubators?

### Enhance 7th St. entry from I-10 to Roosevelt

- People come off freeway too quickly are dangerous for homeless unsafely crossing over the medium.
- Decorative art fence with light to ensure safe turn.
- Add activities, workforce, and RFPs on Jefferson in Downtown Phoenix

### Housing

- Support affordable housing to prevent evictions.
- Encourage community backing for affordable housing projects.

### Small Businesses (Broadway: 7th–32nd St.)

- Businesses are closing due to lack of funding. How can we support them with funding and education?
  - CED Response: Increase community engagement and public outreach on a project.

## Office of Homeless Solutions

### Washington Shelter & Emergency Response

- How can we give the Maricopa County Justice Court information they need to help provide resources for people going through the justice process?

### Feeders at Perry Park

- The park is under construction, with issues arising from street feeders offering food and clothing to the unsheltered, which places a burden on the community.
  - Suggestion: Street feeders should be required to clean the area the following day and explore ways to educate them on best practices for helping the unsheltered.

### Eviction Assistance

- Collaborate with Justice of the Peace to enhance eviction assistance programs for residents in need.

### Community Win

- 51st Ave & Baseline: 350 less calls for service in the last 90 days than last summer!

## Police Department

### 7th St & I-10 Overpass

- Ongoing issues with people who appear to be homeless but are dealing drugs under the overpass.

### Trespassing and Reporting

- Residents should obtain an ATA for trespassing, allows for more effective reports.

### Parking & Alley Issues

- 18th Pl, Wier and Broadway: Illegal parking, problematic apartment activity, and parking in the alley.
  - PD, NSD

### Perry Park

- Address speeding issues on 31st - 36th St, between Windsor and Yale

## Parks and Recreation

### Perry Park

- OHS: New ordinance will help us properly activate parks.
- Suggestion: Engage youth through art murals and drug prevention programs. Launch neighborhood and "No Smoking" campaigns
  - Focus on bad behavior prevention by activating, education, and empowering youth in the area.

### LACC (Laveen Area Conveyance Channel)

- Sidewalk, turf, water pump issues

- **Park's Response:** Working on replacing 3 booster pumps and currently seeking funding for this.
- Request to add more art projects along LACC. Would like additional information.
  - Working with Streets to submit for grant opportunities.
- Focus on landscape improvements from 71st Ave W along Baseline

### Grant Park

- Would like to see information regarding incoming splash pad, want to learn about Master Plan.
- Desire for more youth programming, additional trees, and enhanced lighting.
  - **Response:** Public meetings will be had for splash pads, they are reaching out to nonprofits to develop new programming, and exploring funding for additional lighting at the playground.

### Central City South Area

- Request for more staffing and programming at Grant Park, Central, and Barrios Unidos
  - Response: Green Valley and Barrios Unidos facilities were shuttered during budget cuts from 2006-2007. Can reach out to Contracts team for potential RFP opportunities for adult programming.
