



Phoenix Summer Safety Operation Totals 5/1/24 - 7/31/24:

- **980 heat related** calls for service (Source: Phoenix FD). Of those calls, only 131 were within a mile of a cooling or respite center during extended operating hours.
- **18,339 visits** in respite and extended hour cooling centers (based on intake forms received).
- Overall, 6 and 7pm have seen the highest number of people arriving.
- Walk/Bike (74%) has been the most popular method of getting to the cooling center.
- Returning visitors account for 56% of intake forms, followed by word of mouth (31%) for how visitors hear about cooling centers.
- **15,930 visitors (87%)** indicated they are experiencing homelessness.
- **16,073 visitors (88%)** indicated they just want to get cool and don't need any additional services or referrals.
- 660 visitors received direct onsite assistance from CBI with various shelter or homeless solutions referrals. 25 visitors required additional follow up for their referral, which was submitted by the Office of Emergency Management on their behalf.


ASU Medical Students

On Wednesdays, ASU medical students are on site at Burton Barr to assist citizens with basic medical needs. On July 31st, they assisted visitors with 23 blood glucose checks, 11 blood pressure checks, wound care, distributed cooling towels, water and snack. Students also packed Naloxone kits and spent time in the children's area.

Referrals

23 referrals were processed and received direct onsite assistance from CBI. There was no additional follow-up required from the City of Phoenix or the Office of Emergency Management to submit a referral on their behalf.








