








Total Phoenix PIT Count, 2017-2024







Encampment Around Key Campus

 High profile downtown area between City Hall and State Capitol (7th Avenue to 15th Avenue, Jefferson to the railroad tracks)

•As many as 700-1,000 individuals in the area around the Campus between 2022 - 2023

•15 streets with tents closed to camping

- **718** total individuals encountered on the streets closed
- **590** accepted alternative placement
- **50%** of those who accepted now in housing or in shelter
















Phoenix Community Court

- Launched January 2024

Property Storage

- Storage for property at new shelters
- Storage for individuals around Key Campus
- Unattended Property Storage
 - Storage notification allows for engagement
 - 174 bins stored since inception
 - 19 bins reunited with people

Phoenix CARES Process

After Resident Submits Report of Encampment:

- Public Property Process:
 - CBI Outreach Team Deployed
 - OHS, Public Works, Streets, Parks Deployed
 - Police Deployed (if necessary)
- Private Property Process:
 - Neighborhood Services Deployed
 - Work with Private Property Owner
 - CBI and/or OHS Outreach Teams Deployed
 - Police Deployed (if necessary)

Public Property Cycle Time: 6 Days

Camping Ordinance 23-30B

- Restricts camping within 500 ft of:
 - School (including university)
 - Childcare Center
 - Shelter
 - Parks

City of Phoenix

- Signage/Posting Requirements
- Known hotspots, happening now
- Property owners can request via CARES
- Grants Pass Supreme Court Ruling
