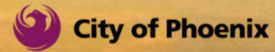

# What is the Consolidated Plan?

## HUD's Mission

- Create strong, sustainable, inclusive communities and quality affordable homes for all.

## Entitlement Community

- Participating communities who are eligible to receive money through HUD's funding formula.

# What is the Consolidated Plan?

- Required by HUD every 5 years
- Public participation/input is required
- Draft will be submitted to City Council for review and approval
- Due to HUD May 15, 2025

# What is the Consolidated Plan?

## The Consolidated Plan serves three basic functions:

- Planning document developed with input from residents
- Defines local priorities relative to:
  - Housing and homelessness
  - Community and economic development
  - Infrastructure and enhancement
  - Public services and facilities
- Official application to HUD for federal funds

# What is the Consolidated Plan?

## Community Development Block Grant (CDBG)

*Provides resources to address housing and community development needs that benefit low- and moderate-income individuals*

## HOME Investment Partnership (HOME)

*Creates housing opportunities for low-income households*

### Federal Programs

## Housing Opportunities for Persons With AIDS (HOPWA)

*Provides housing assistance and related supportive services to those living with AIDS*

## Emergency Solutions Grant (ESG)

*Assists individuals and families to regain permanent housing after experiencing a housing crisis or homelessness*
