

Historic Preservation Researching an Historic Property

People research historic properties for many reasons, including:

- ❖ Documenting the history of a building for listing on the National Register of Historic Places or a local register such as the Phoenix Historic Property Register.
- Providing property owners with a better understanding of the physical history of a building for a more accurate rehabilitation and/or restoration.
- Providing a link to the people & events historically connected with the building.
- When researching, keep in mind that you will be developing a narrative history & determining where your property fits into the city's history & development. Properties can be individually significant but may also derive significance as part of a larger historic district.

The following are questions to keep in mind when researching your historic property:

- What is the historic name of the property?
- ❖ How many structures & other resources make up the property? What are the construction dates? What is the architectural style(s)?
- Who were the architect & builder? Is either of them well known for their skill or expertise? Is this a particularly unique example of their work?
- Does the property include a rare building or property type, or is it representative of many other properties in its vicinity?
- Does it exemplify a particular architectural style or exhibit unique craftsmanship or details?
- What changes have been made over time & when? Are the changes significant?
- ❖ How large is the property? Where is it located, & what are its boundaries?
- What is the development history of the area? How does it relate to a tract or subdivision developed during a particular period?
- How was the property used during its period of significance & how is it used today?
- Who occupied or used the property historically? Did they individually make any important contributions to Phoenix history?
- Does the property have important associations with ethnic/cultural/social groups?
