ECO Stations Make Recycling Easier

Recycling is now even easier with the city of Phoenix's ECO stations. These huge rolloff bins are strategically located in city-owned parks and near clusters of multi-family housing complexes. Residents and businesses are encouraged to use the ECO stations to place their recyclables at any time.

The bins display the top 10 materials accepted by the city's recycling program: cardboard materials, papers, food boxes, mail and junk mail, beverage cans, food cans, glass beverage bottles, food jars in glass and plastic, plastic jugs and beverage cartons and plastic bottles with caps on. The weather in Phoenix during these spring months is beautiful, which allows plants and lawns to thrive. Remember to water deeply but infrequently.

Water desert-adapted trees and shrubs (if needed) every seven to 21 days. Bermuda lawn can thrive with watering every seven days, while winter rye needs water every four days. Sprinklers are a substitute for Mother Nature, so if a rainstorm occurs (at least 1/2"), skip your next watering session.


Hooray for Free City Pools Will **Museum Day!**

The new platform will allow anyone to search the city's data and interact with that data to preview, filter, and visualize charts or graphs online.
