

## Save the Date: Employee Memorial Ceremony



The event begins at 9 a.m. inside the Orpheum Theatre next to Phoenix City Hall. Following the ceremony inside, guests are invited to step outside to participate in a "Line of Honor" ceremony for the families as they walk to the memorial wall.
