On Tuesday, the city of Phoenix lost Police K9 Bane. He and his handler, a 14-year veteran officer, were helping to find a carjacking suspect. Doing his job, Bane was sent into a home where the suspect was hiding and during that response, he died.

"We sent Bane in to do what the dogs do. They are our protectors, they are our partners and it's definitely with heart that we lost Bane," said Phoenix Police Chief Jeri Williams.

Bane, a 3-year-old Belgian Malinois, joined the Phoenix Police Department a little more than a year ago. A police procession took place Tuesday evening to honor him.

An outpouring of support filled social media pages throughout the evening to offer thanks, and condolences, for Bane, his handler and all the women and men who wear the Phoenix Police uniform.
