HEAT ADVISORY

This weekend's weather is expected to be record breaking with Friday reaching 114 degrees, 117 degrees on Saturday and 115 degrees on Sunday. If you are working or playing outside this week, please remember to take some safety precautions:

- Drink plenty of water
- Cover skin with sunscreen
- ♦ Take breaks in the shade

Use the buddy system to look for signs of heat exhaustion which include: fatigue, heavy sweating, headache, cramps, dizziness, high pulse rate and nausea or vomiting.

SUMMER HEAT RELIEF EFFORTS

The onset of triple-digit temperatures means it is time for the annual Summer Respite Program.

The city of Phoenix Human Services Department is asking employees and the public to donate unopened water bottles, sunscreen, new underwear, white socks, white T-shirts, insect repellent and prepackaged snack items to be collected at the city's family services centers. The items will be distributed to the homeless by experienced homeless outreach teams. Monetary donations also are accepted. Residents can bring their tax-deductible donations to any of the city's three family services centers, weekdays from 8 a.m. - 4:30 p.m.:



During the summer months, Maricopa County experiences a considerable increase in the formation of ground-level ozone, which can trigger a variety of health problems including chest pain, coughing, throat irritation and congestion. Ozone pollution can also worsen bronchitis, emphysema and asthma. Ground-level ozone forms when pollutants such as vehicle emissions react to Arizona's intense sunlight.
