The city of Phoenix is ready to present its new budget for the next fiscal year.

The City Manager recently presented the Trial Budget to the Mayor and Council. You can <u>watch that here</u>.

This year, there are 15 public meetings for the public to attend. These meetings are critical in order to get input from residents and business owners about how the city's money is best spent.

City employees are encouraged to also attend one of these meetings to learn more about the plan for the next fiscal year. A calendar with times and locations can be <u>found here</u>.

Any employees who wish to attend the hearings must do so on their own time, unless they are officially representing their department with permission of the department head. Keep in mind that employees cannot wear city uniforms to the meetings.

Council members and city staff will answer questions and talk about specific district issues.


