RECORDS REQUESTS

The city of Phoenix has modernized its public records process with a new online system. The new streamlined process is intended to better serve customers and make the internal process by city staff more efficient. Customers can now submit a records request where they will now receive an automated follow-up email acknowledging the request. From there, the information is processed and tracked digitally by the city's Public Records Request Coordinator.

This new process includes all city departments except for Police, Fire and Municipal Court. In addition, customers can visit the main 'Public Records Page' on the city website and search for the most commonly requested information by department. Questions?
