

**MEDIA ADVISORY
HOMICIDE/AGGRAVATED ASSAULT
OFFICER INVOLVED SHOOTING**

On October 25, 2020 at approximately 10:05 p.m., Officers responded to a fight in the area of 2200 West Roy Rogers Road. Information received by 911 was that the suspect went to a neighbor and asked to borrow a gun to kill himself. Additional calls, believed to be from the suspect, asked 911 to send police while being evasive about what was occurring.

Two officers, riding as a two-person unit arrived on scene and walked towards the residence. The 53-year-old suspect emerged from behind a parked vehicle in the driveway of the suspect residence and began walking towards officers. The suspect stated he had a gun and simultaneously pointed what was perceived as a gun at one of the officers. Both officers fired at the suspect, ending the threat. Officers detained the suspect and rendered aid.

As additional officers arrived, they entered the residence and located two victims, a 46-year-old female and a 13-year-old male, with obvious signs of trauma. Phoenix Fire personnel arrived and transported both victims to the hospital in extremely critical condition. The female victim was later pronounced deceased at the hospital. The juvenile male remains in critical condition. Fire pronounced the suspect deceased on scene.

Officers also located an 11-year-old female at one of the neighbor's residences. She was uninjured. At this time, it is unknown if she is a witness to the homicide. Detectives learned there was a domestic relationship between the suspect and adult female victim and the two children are theirs.

There were no injuries to any officers.

A black hard-shell eyeglasses case was used as the simulated weapon and was recovered next to the suspect.

The investigation is ongoing.
