Mobile Home Fire Leaves Two Dead

(November 27, 2024): Phoenix detectives arrest one man for manslaughter in relation to a mobile home fire that left two dead and sends another to the hospital.

On November 24, 2024, around 9:45 a.m., officers responded to the area of 2200 E Michigan Avenue for an injured person call as a result of a house fire. Fire personnel extinguished the fire and reported to police that two victims had died. Phoenix police arson investigators, along with members of the Violent Crimes Bureau, responded to assume the investigation.

Detectives worked relentlessly in investigating this incident. After processing the scene and conducting multiple interviews, investigators identify, locate and apprehend the suspect, 22-year-old Joel Hernandez Anaya. Joel was transported to Phoenix Police Headquarters where he was interviewed by investigators. In his post Miranda interview, Joel made incriminating statements and was booked into Maricopa County Jail on multiple felony charges to include, two counts of Reckless Manslaughter, a class 2 felony and two counts of attempted Manslaughter, a class 3 felony.

Next of Kin notification is still pending; victims' names will not be release at this time.
