

Project Area


West of State Route 51: Oak St. between 3rd St. & State Route 51

East of State Route 51: 20th Pl. & 20th St. between Oak Street & Grand Canal



Project Goals

- Provide connectivity to other bicycle corridor projects
- Develop a low-stress/low-volume bicycle/pedestrian corridor
- > Enhance neighborhood character
- Accommodate multi-modal transportation while maintaining existing travel lanes





Public Involvement

- > Interviewed neighborhood groups & key stakeholder groups
- Coronado Neighborhood Association October 2016
- Complete Streets Advisory Board February 2017
- > Public Meeting February 2017 (65+ attendees)
- > Surveys 150+ responses, majority in favor of project







Public Input Highlights

- Speed is a concern throughout the corridor
- > Green paint at conflict points is desirable
- Additional street trees and landscaping is needed
- Drainage improvements are needed
- > Bicycle improvements should be protected from vehicle traffic
- Parking is a concern especially on the north side of Oak St between 3rd St. & 7th St. and 16th St. & 18th St




Key Design Elements

- Maintain existing number of travel lanes
- Utilize existing pavement with minor resurfacing
- Maximize parking in high demand areas
- Incorporate traffic calming to slow traffic
- Incorporate "Advisory Bike Lanes" to allow parking on both sides

3rd Street to 7th Street – Advisory Bike Lane & Parking







7th Street to 14th Street – Curb Bulb-Outs & Traffic Circle




14th Street to 16th Street – Green Alley
