Short Description of your organization and mission: The overall goal of the Office of Heat Response and Mitigation tree programs is to impact the community of Phoenix through fostering a more resilient and equitable community by spearheading strategic tree planting initiatives throughout various schools and neighborhoods. Primary Function/Purpose: The Community Relations Coordinator will engage directly with the community, assisting residents in applying for the Community Canopy Grant. This role involves distributing flyers, educating community members about the benefits of trees, and promoting the importance of urban community forestry projects. The coordinator will serve as a key liaison, ensuring residents are well-informed and supported throughout the grant application process.

Major Responsibilities and Duties: Distributing informational flyers and materials to promote the Community Canopy Grant within target neighborhoods, answering questions from community members about the grant program, assisting residents with the grant application process, including answering questions and offering guidance, maintaining records of community interactions and application support to track engagement and outcomes, etc.

- Student loan forbearance and interest repayment for qualifying federal student loans
